Even as believers we all face unexpected challenges - the loss of a loved one, a personal failure, a retrenchment, a sickness etc. It's easy to become overwhelmed, but rather than complain and wallow in self-pity, go deeper in Christ and instead have a report of faith, "All is well. God is fully in control." Then, because you are rooted in the Most High God, you will feel the peace that surpasses all understanding, and have the strength to endure what the enemy hoped would take you out.
