

In 2 Kings 4, things were so bad for the poor widow that the creditors were coming to take her two sons as payment for her bills. When she said she had nothing at all in her house, she didn't realize she already had what she needed for the miracle. The principle is: Your talents and resources may seem like not enough, but when you use what you have, God will multiply it.

Notice that she said she had nothing "except" a small jar of oil. God is going to use what comes after the "except". "I have nothing except this small talent and a little training. I have nothing except a few connections." God is going to take what you think is insignificant, and turn it into something extraordinary. When you come to the end of what you can do, when you don't have the resources and run out of options, you are in the perfect position for God to show out in your life. God is about to do something unusual, something you couldn't make happen yourself.
