

In Acts 16, Paul and Silas had been beaten and put in jail for sharing the good news of the Gospel. The opposition had stirred up trouble, and things were out of their control. They had all kinds of questions to which they had no answers. Would they have a fair trial...or be held there...or put to death? They could have been upset, worried, fearful, and losing sleep, but at midnight they were singing praises to God.
